Buckeye Hills Regional Council Regional Transportation Planning Organization has officially released a Request for Qualifications for a consulting firm to develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for the region's eight counties: Athens, Hocking, Meigs, Monroe, Morgan, Noble, Perry, and Washington. The effort is supported by a \$250,000 award through the U.S. Department of Transportation's Safe Streets and Roads for All program.

This project will create a strategic, data-driven roadmap to reduce and ultimately eliminate traffic fatalities and serious injuries across the region using USDOT's Safe System Approach. The plan will identify high-risk corridors and intersections, establish the region's high-injury network, and recommend practical, evidence-based strategies to improve safety for all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, drivers, transit riders, and older adults.

The selected consultant will be responsible for conducting transportation safety analyses, reviewing five years of the most recent crash data, and developing an interactive High Injury Network map and online tools that help communities understand local crash trends and safety priorities. The project will also include public outreach and stakeholder engagement designed to gather input from local governments, community partners, and residents, including disadvantaged and underrepresented populations, through both virtual and in-person opportunities.

In addition to identifying priority locations for improvement, the final action plan will include short- and long-term recommendations, performance measures, and implementation strategies to guide future planning and funding decisions. The plan is intended to support communities in pursuing future SS4A implementation funding and other state and federal transportation resources. The final document will also be public-facing and designed to meet accessibility requirements for online use.
